24TH TASMANIAN WINE SHOW

The Tasmanian Wine Show, the regional show for all the State's wines, was first held in 1991, with James Halliday as Chairman of judges of both panels; one of judges awarding medals and one of winemakers providing technical feedback.

Huon Hooke joined James to judge the Show the following year, and they returned most years since then, overseeing the growth of the Tasmanian wine industry and to fly-fish the State's rivers and lakes. The contribution of both James and Huon over 24 years has been immense. Huon is now Chief of Judges and James, the Emeritus Chairman, continues his active involvement including the Trophy Presentation Dinner.

The third judge position on the panel has provided opportunities for both local and international judges. Also many in the industry have experienced judging for the first time as an Associate at the Tasmanian Wine Show.

The ongoing support of our sponsors is greatly appreciated.

The volunteers who have selflessly given up their time over many years fully deserve our thanks, and the contribution of Nigel Donachie as Chief Stewart and of the current stewarding team are acknowledged.
