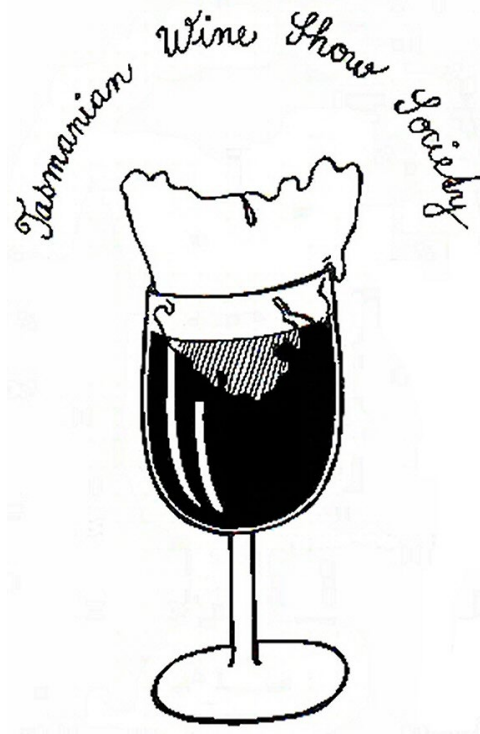

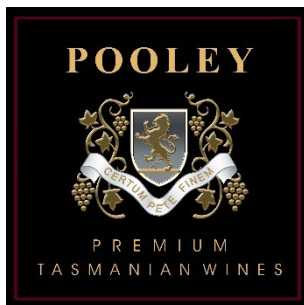

31ST TASMANIAN WINE SHOW

What a great Show!

Following a year with multiple precedents, including the 'Spanish Flu' one hundred years ago, the 31st Tasmanian Wine Show was a triumph of teamwork over adversity.

The 2021 Show marked the 30th anniversary of Huon Hooke's first judging role in 1992 and was to see the smooth transition of Huon handing over to the incoming Chair of Judges Adam Wadewitz. With Huon's flights and accommodation all booked, Covid intervened once again and four Tasmanian judges volunteered a day each to make up the panel.

Adam and fellow South Australian winemaker judge Natalie Cleghorn anchored a revolving panel of local judges and associate judges supported by a core team of volunteer stewards, committee and Drysdale TasTAFE staff members.

The Tasmanian Wine Show has many unique aspects and to go ahead with 410 entries from about 70 exhibitors has been a remarkable achievement. The winning Tasmanian wines are simply wonderful!
