Tasmanian Wine Show Co-Vice President's speech January 12th, 2023 at Riversdale Estate, Coal River Valley, Tasmania

Ladies and gentlemen, Tas Wine Show committee, judges, sponsors and honoured guest, Mr Mark Bowles, Deputy Secretary in the Department of State Growth; welcome to the Presentation Dinner of the 33rd Annual Tasmanian Wine Show.

I take this time to acknowledge the passing of our president, Phil Laing, who died on December 28th after being diagnosed with Motor Neurone Disease in May. Phil had many good, good friends; more than anyone I've ever known. The Tasmanian wine industry has had no better friend.

The Tasmania Wine Show was first conducted in 1991 with forty-three wines presented. This year, 360 wines in 27 classes were judged over three days. More than ten percent of the wines received gold medals.

This year was the first year we have run two judging panels led by Adam Wadewitz and Virginia Willcock. I know Phil would have been proud of the results and of the performance of judges and stewards. The dedicated group of enthusiastic wine lovers volunteer their time, without which, the show would not proceed. Please, thank my fellow committee members, Penny Jones and Phil Dunham and the stellar stewarding team.

I met Phil Laing in 1995, when we were both teachers at Ouse District School in the Upper Derwent Valley, and joined the committee by year's end. Initially, I agreed to a three-year term after which I handed Phil a formal letter of resignation. Phil read my letter, screwed it up and tossed it in the waste paper bin. He was a difficult person to say no to.

The numbers of entries in the Tasmanian Wine Show grew, principally because, Phil developed a personal relationship with all producers with regular visits to vineyards and wineries, running wine tastings, and writing thee books on Tasmanian wine.

Every major event has its tribulations. One such occasion was when the air conditioning system at Drysdale, Launceston failed and it literally rained inside the judging room. Unflappable, Phil arranged to move all the Show's equipment and wine to Hobart Drysdale and the Show went off without another issue.

We've managed to get through the week because of Phil's teacher voice in our heads and the great team he brought together.

I now welcome to the microphone Chairman of Judges, Mr Adam Wadewitz, 2022 Winemaker of the Year, Chief Winemaker at Shaw & Smith, MMAD Vineyard in the Adelaide Hills, and Tolpuddle Vineyard in the Coal River Valley. To quote M.W. Michael Hill Smith, "... a once in a generation winemaker at the height of his powers."
